
Vagabond around the Arctic

VAGABOND

Vagabond is an **expedition yacht** designed to sail in ice. Since year 2000, her captain Eric Brossier prepared her as a unique logistic support, a floating and moving base camp for scientists, sportsmen, or artists fond of Polar Regions.

- On 12th May 2002, Vagabond left Saint-Quay-Portrieux (Brittany, France) with equipment and food for more than one year, ready to winter somewhere in Siberia...
- On 31st August 2002, Vagabond crossed Bering Strait and became the first yacht to sail the North-East Passage without wintering, and without icebreaker. Her crew has won Awards from Alain Bombard, the Yacht Club de France, the Royal Cruising Club, and the Ocean Cruising Club.
- On 1st April 2003, the polar yacht will leave **Kamchatka** where she is wintering, and will sail to **Japan** for a very expected stop in Nagoya, birthplace of the captain, where is taking place an important sailing event at the end of May; she will also assist a sea kayak expedition around Hokkaido.



- In June 2003, Vagabond will sail across North Pacific up to Bering Strait. She will pass Kuril Islands, following the route of La Pérouse, and stop at **Bering Island**, named after death of the famous explorer ; she will then sail to Yttagran Island in Chukotka, where is the shaman site Whale Alley, before reaching **Uelen**, a village of walrus hunters, just behind Bering Strait.
- In July 2003, as soon as ice conditions will be fair, Vagabond will enter the **North-West Passage**, the sea route going from Bering Strait to Greenland, via Alaska and Canada. Besides completion of the first Arctic circum-

navigation, by sailing the two famous Passages one after the other, Vagabond will contribute to some research on **Franklin**'s wrecks, Terror and Erebus, with experts and specific equipments.

Vagabond is expected in Saint-Quay-Portrieux, her home port, in October 2003, if ice conditions in Canadian Arctic are favourable, then in **Paris Boat Show in December 2003**.

In spring 2003 will be published the **story** of the 2002 expedition, the North-East Passage, and France Television will broadcast a 52 minutes **film**. The second part of this expedition, the North-West Passage, will be shared live with **Internet** (satellite link from aboard), then with

several films, a book, and talks in France and abroad.

In order to better prepare the coming part of this ambitious expedition, and to share more the adventure, we are looking for a **sponsor** who whish to enter in close partnership with Vagabond's crew, whose cohesion and commitment allow to discover on sail the most remote places and people in the Arctic.
